




Sensational Skyview

As a reminder, prior to making any exterior change or improvements to your home or property, you must submit a Request for Change (RFC) to your regional and master association's Architectural Control Board (sometimes called Architectural Control Committee or Architectural Review Board) and receive approval before beginning the project. These forms can be found under the POA section of the www.clubhappenings. com website. If you have questions related to the architectural review process, please feel free to call the POA office.

We have periodically received courteous when driving through our questions about topics that POA members have seen on various social media platforms. Oftentimes, it is difficult for users to determine the veracity of information posted on these sites, or whether it accurately represents the facts. 





10 Tips To Keep Your Vehicle In Top Shape

The colder months are a great time to make sure your car is properly cleaned, maintained and in tip-top shape. Here's how to keep your vehicle looking and running sharp.

- 1. Change the oil. When was the last time you got an oil change? If you don't know, it might be time to get one, or at least check your dipstick or sticker to plan ahead for your next one. Changing your vehicle's oil is the key to keeping the engine running well. Change your oil yourself or take it in to a service center and use the oil that is best for your car.
- **2. Take care of the tires.** Routinely check your tire pressure, monitor wear and rotate the tires. Avoid a flat tire by rotating tires every 5-10,000 miles. Inflate and deflate tires as necessary to ensure the best gas mileage.
- **3. Test all lights.** Thoroughly inspect each bulb in your car. Replace bulbs if they are burnt out or dim.
- **4. Check fluids.** Check yourself or have a professional look under the hood of your car. Make sure there is enough oil, coolant, power steering fluid, brake and transmission fluid in the vehicle. If you spot a leak, get it repaired as soon as possible.
- **5. Check breaks.** If you hear a squeaking noise when you brake, it is likely time to install a new set of breaks. Have your brake pads inspected and pay attention to the way your car brakes. If you feel or hear anything abnormal, have it checked by a professional.
- **6. Change engine air filter.** Your vehicle's air filter should be changed once a year for optimal air quality while driving. Change it as needed to avoid allowing dirt and particulate into the engine.
- **7. Replace wipers.** Inspect wiper blades for functionality and replace them as needed. Especially ahead of the rainy season, replace any worn or damaged blades to ensure visual safety while driving.
- **8. Protect from harsh weather.** Florida's heat can be damaging to your vehicle. Ensure to minimize sun exposure to avoid interior plastic and seat damage, and exterior paint damage. Park in the shade or under covering, and consider using a window deflector.
- **9. Clean.** Detail your vehicle often to remove grime, germs and hazardous road materials. Vacuum, wash and wax as needed.
- **10. Fix problems promptly.** Don't wait to go to the mechanic if something seems off with your vehicle. This will often save your car from further damage and costs.
