Staying on track with your exercise program can be difficult at times, so before you lose momentum and give up, try these 10 helpful tips to help you keep it going forward for long-term success.

- 1. Forget that image you had of yourself back in high school; start a new profile of yourself through exercise.
- 2. We know that sometimes time restraints can be the problem, so write it down like an appointment.
- 3. Start with a 20-minute walk or a 30-minute bike ride if you are just returning to working out. This is a good start, and you can grow from there.
- 4. You can include your family; run while your son or daughter rides their bike or walk the dog. The key is to just get moving.
- 5. Pain is sometimes part of the process; remember that you will have some muscle soreness, it's normal.
- 6. Keep a pace that is comfortable for you at first and then increase

your intensity level slightly as you move forward with your program.


7. At some point, sign up for a local event; maybe a 5K



run/walk. It's a goal to strive for and adds some meaning to your working out.

- 8. Follow a healthy diet; if you limit your calorie intake too much, you will not have enough energy to work out and your metabolism will slow down. (Eat regularly)
- 9. There are energy peaks during our days; so understanding your energy cycle will help. Try to complete your workouts when you feel the most energetic and positive.
- 10. Make all your workouts fun; if you enjoy what you are doing, you are more likely to stick with it.

Remember it is also very important to tweak and spice up your workouts periodically to challenge yourself and to keep your exercise program from becoming too routine.

10 Tips for Spring Cleaning Your Garage

- **1. Have a Plan.** Make a list of things that need to get done or sketch out a rough plan of the final result. Then open those doors, let some air and light in, back out your car, and begin.
- **2. Pick Your Process**. Tackling the easiest things first, like gathering up recyclables or tagging items you can donate or bring to the dump. Empty the entire garage out and build it back up, piece-by-piece. Or pick a small section that's bothering you most and begin there.
- **3. Deep Clean**. An empty garage is the easiest to clean. Start with a good thorough sweep of the floor. Dust the shelves, cabins, crevices and every nook of the garage. Wipe the ceiling to remove smoke stains, greasy dirt, and cobwebs. Run a water hose to wash down the floor and drive all the dirt out to the outside of the garage.
- **4. Have You Used It?** Itemize things into "use regularly," "use annually," "never use," and "sentimental storage" categories. Everything in "never use" can be donated or tossed; check annual and regular use items for signs of wear and tear and replace or store; when it comes to things that are purely sentimental, focus on what you really want to keep and what you actually have room to store.
- **5. Utilize Vertical Space.** A garage with a parked car or two is tight, so use your walls, even ceilings, as best you can to maximize space. The ideal options are open metal or wire shelving systems, with tubs and bins for things like holiday decorations.
- **6. Hang Things.** If square footage is an issue, use a peg board with hooks for vertical wall hanging. Hang shovels and trowels on the wall to save space. You can also hang golf bags, tennis rackets, and bikes.
- **7. Wheel It.** Keep your tools in a wheeled bucket or wheelbarrow so you can easily pull it out whenever you need to get to work on those weeds.
- **8. Find Alternative Storage.** If you're using something regularly, it should be kept in the house. A coat rack in the garage may seem like a good idea, but your clothes could be exposed to whatever critters are crawling around in there and the damp, cold, or humid conditions can lead to mold. Avoid shelving dry goods or other food items in the garage.
- **9. Consider Placement.** Make sure the items you use more often are in more accessible areas.
- **10. Give Every Item a Home.** Label everything from the hooks and pegboard stations to your storage bins. This will ensure that items will be put back in their proper place.
